1. Obedience skills are required to ensure that the dog can be worked and transported without interference from other dogs and personnel, is under the control of the handler, can be left safely and, if necessary, be evacuated by someone other than the handler in an emergency.

2. The dog may change positions but must remain within 5 ft of its original location even when distractions include other dogs and strangers moving close by. **For dogs engaged in collapsed building/disaster work, it is recommended that this area be reduced to the body length of the dog.** The demonstration should include a minimum of three other dogs that are within 20 ft of the demonstrating dog.

3. **Dogs engaged in collapsed structure/disaster work additionally should demonstrate the ability to change their pace at the request of the handler and to be directed to more than two distinct areas, which have different elevations and are separated by at least 25 yards.**

4. Climb onto and walk along a log or other narrow obstacle without jumping off. It is recommended that the log or obstacle be taller and wider than the dog.
5. Walk through a culvert or small tunnel that has at least one right or left turn. Ideally, some portion of the culvert or tunnel will be of a size that requires the dog to crawl on its belly.
6. Long jump over a ditch, which is as wide as the height of the dog's withers.
7. Climb a flat-runged ladder at least 6-ft long, which is set at a 45° angle.
8. Walk from one end of a teeter-totter (no more than 12-in. wide) to the other without jumping off.
9. Maneuver over 1 each 22-in. high log or barrel on its side after checking the other side for safety.
10. Climb a ramp, or ladder, then proceed to the end of a second plank and return without jumping off. The ramps and planks should no more than 12 in. wide, at least 10 ft long, and at least 3 ft above the ground.
11. Climb onto and cross a wobbly surface, for example, warped plywood, which is at least 12 ft long, 12 in. wide, and 3 ft above the ground.
12. Climb onto and cross a non-stationary plank, (supported by two barrels on their side) which is no more than 12 ft long by 12 in wide.

13. The dog should be able to indicate that it has detected the object of its search. This indication may be in the form of a classic physical alert such as a bark, whine, jump or capture of bringsel, or, in some other predetermined response that is known and can be described by the handler.

14. The dog, on command, should be able to leave a person found in order to search for additional subjects.

15. Upon finding the subject of a search, the dog should be able to execute a refind.
